

Using Picture Books to Nurture the Core Competencies

Picture books provide a wonderful entry point for the Core Competencies into the classroom. Self-reflecting on aspects of literacy through the Core Competencies allows students to make connections and explore literature in a meaningful way from different perspectives.

The following pages contain sample documents that can be used to help students develop a deeper understanding of what the Core Competencies really mean. There are four samples for each competency. All have the Core Competency listed at the top and a simplified definition of the competency.

The first sample in each section is simpler, for students who may be non-writers, the second, third and fourth examples grow in sophistication. The different levels can be used to differentiate in one classroom or be used at different grade levels. These documents and examples can be edited and adapted for different books and focuses by simply changing the prompts.

To use these tools:

- Teachers should choose a picture book that suits the current unit of study and connects to the Core Competency
- Introduce the Core Competency to the students
- Explore examples of what the competency means to students
 - **LIT 44 Reading Strategy 1: "Access background information."**
- Solicit examples of the competency from the students
 - **LIT44 Reading Strategy 6: "Connect what you read with what you already know."**
- Explain the book title to help students develop deeper understanding.
 - **Reading Strategy 2: "Predict what will be learned or what will happen."**
- After reading the book aloud, discuss how the Core Competency was illustrated through the story.
- Students reflect on the chosen Core Competency and the actions of the characters in the book and then make personal connections
